ABOUT OUR COMMUNITIES

ABOUT SCHREIBER

The Township of Schreiber was established between the years of 1883-1884, due to the extensive work on the 200 mile Lake Superior section of the Canadian Pacific Railway. Many Italian immigrants travelled to Schreiber in search of employment on the Railway in 1890. Today, Schreiber boasts a strong Italian culture, with many of the descendants of the first Italian immigrants still living in Schreiber, creating a dynamic Township that was built on strong family values, workmanship, and tradition.



Schreiber was officially incorporated as a Township on July 13, 1901. Schreiber continues to celebrate their extensive history and proud heritage every third week in July, which has been dubbed Heritage Days in the Township. There are many visual reminders throughout Schreiber of the strong relationship between the Township and the Canadian Pacific Railway.

QUICK FACT: The Town of Schreiber is named after Sir Collingwood Schreiber, a railway engineer, founding member of the Canadian Society of Civil Engineers, and deputy minister of Railways and Canals.

ABOUT ROSSPORT & JACKFISH

Much like Schreiber, Jackfish has strong ties to the Canadian Pacific Railway, dating back to the late 1800s. Jackfish's primary industry, however, was Lake Superior. It was the freighters and fishing that kept Jackfish a bustling community between the late 1800s to the 1940s.

However, the modern steam engine and sea lamprey's forever changed Jackfish, altogether stopping their main industries. By 1963, Jackfish was no more.

Similarly to both Schreiber and Jackfish, Rosspport too, is closely connected to the Canadian Pacific Railway and the waters of Lake Superior. After the completion of the CPR in 1885, Rosspport became an important commercial fishing centre.

QUICK FACT: Rosspport is named after John Ross, construction manager for the north shore of Lake Superior route of the CP Railway.



QUICK FACT: The name of Terrace Bay originates from a series of lake terraces formed as the water level in Lake Superior lowered following the last ice age.

ABOUT TERRACE BAY

Compared to the other communities, the Township of Terrace Bay is newer in its development. Established in the early 1940s by the decision of the Kimberly Clark Pulp and Paper Company to construct a pulp and paper mill in the area, the Township of Terrace Bay was born.

The pulp mill has been the lifeblood of the region, causing the population in Terrace Bay to fluctuate over the years. In 2005, Kimberly Clark sold the mill, which underwent various owners until 2012, when the Aditya Birla Group purchased the mill, creating the new company AV Terrace Bay Inc. With a \$250 million investment into the mill, a new lease on life has been ushered into the community, creating a new and unexpected boom for the Township.

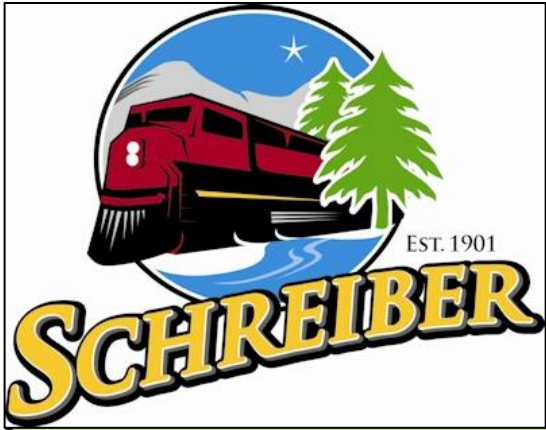

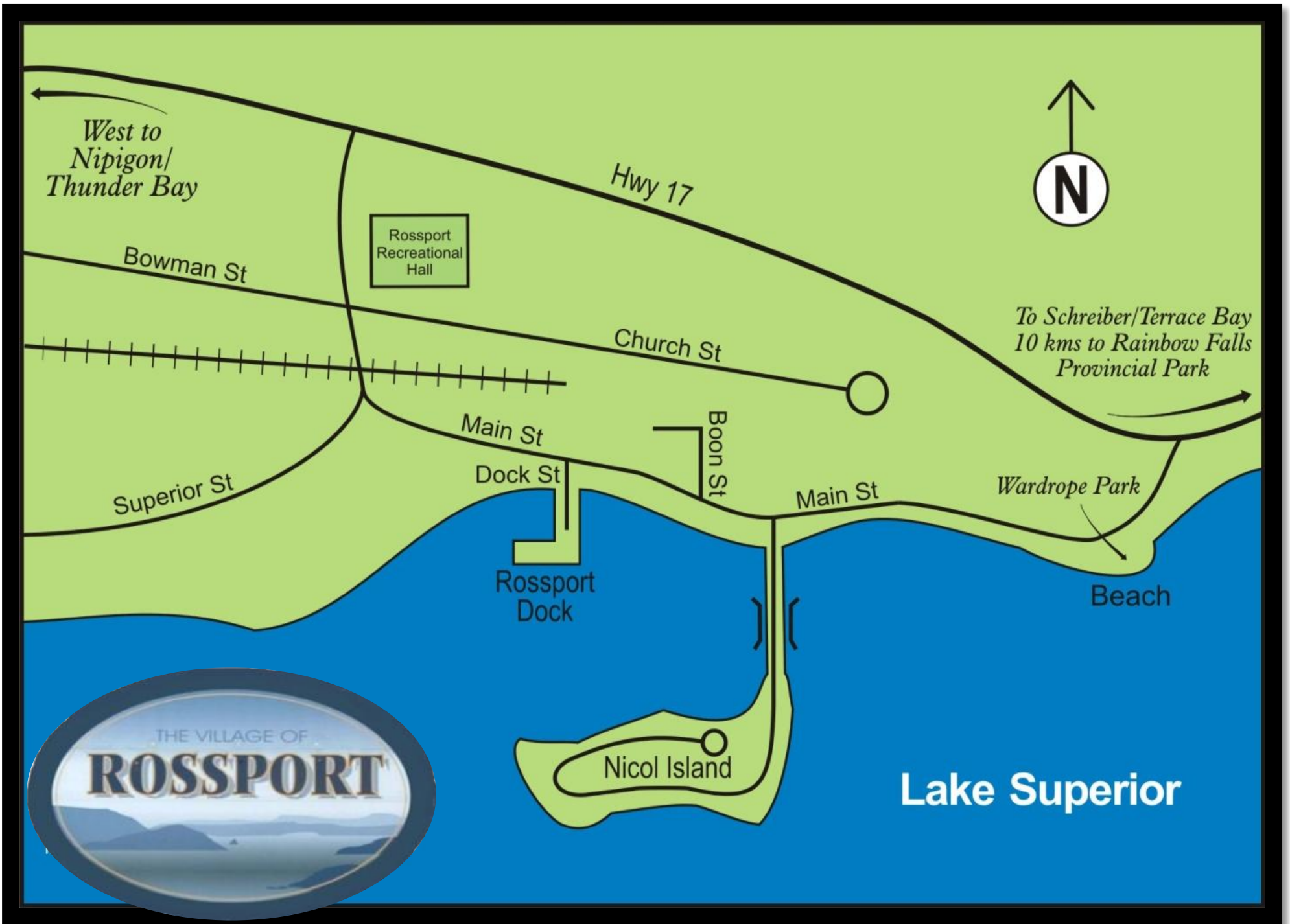

GETTING TO & FROM OUR COMMUNITIES

DRIVING

To operate a car, truck, or van, you need a driver's licence and insurance registration on your vehicle.

Call Ontario Ministry of Transportation for Driver & Licensing general inquiry 1-800-387-3445

In Ontario, everybody in the vehicle must wear a seatbelt. Children under 18 kg (40lbs) must be seated in a car seat that meets the Canadian Motor Vehicle Safety Standards. Most roadways are named in the communities. Drivers must know the rules of driving in Ontario. You can still get a ticket even if you do not know the law.

It is illegal to drive under the influence of alcohol or drugs. It is also against the law to have an open container of alcohol in the vehicle. Fines or temporary loss of driver's licence can result.

When a police car, ambulance, or fire truck has its lights and sirens on, move to the side of the road and slow down and stop as soon as you are able.

WASTE SERVICES

TERRACE BAY & SCHREIBER

HOURS OF OPERATION

MONDAY – SUNDAY 1:00PM – 5:00PM

The Terrace Bay landfill is operated by the Township of Terrace Bay in cooperation with the Township of Schreiber. The landfill is located 5 km West of Terrace Bay town centre. Users require punch cards which are available for purchase at the Municipal Offices.

The site area includes: a recycling depot, a scrap metal transfer and dewatering area for processed sewage and septic waste. Residents can leave their electronic waste at the electronic waste depot at the Terrace Bay Landfill anytime during regular landfill hours.

RECYCLING & WASTE DIVERSION

The Townships of Terrace Bay and Schreiber offer recycling services for its residents at the Landfill. Residents can use the service free of charge and bring their recyclables in clear transparent bags for either containers or paper & cardboard. ELIGIBLE ELECTRONIC WASTE:

*Please note: only these materials will be accepted. The landfill does not accept microwaves. The landfill does not accept fluorescent lights or tubes.

SEWAGE TREATMENT

Sewage in Terrace Bay is treated using settling ponds South of the Township in line with guidelines from the Ministry of the Environment. Sewage in Schreiber is treated by the Township of Schreiber at the Wastewater Treatment Plant.



The Townships of Terrace Bay & Schreiber and the unorganized communities of Rosspport and Jackfish offer sustainable means of reducing waste.



THINGS TO REMEMBER:

- Garbage pick-up in Terrace Bay is every Tuesday morning. All garbage placed at the curb requires a \$2 tag per can which can be purchased at the Municipal Office and participating businesses. For Waste Collection rules visit www.terracebay.ca/green.
- Garbage pick-up in Schreiber is every Wednesday morning by 9:00am.
- Place waste within one foot of the curb for safe and efficient collection.
- Make sure your garbage can lid is securely fastened to avoid animal interference.
- Garbage delivery in Rosspport is every Saturday from 10:00am – 4:00pm, with a \$2.00 charge for each bag. A half-ton drop off of garbage in Rosspport is \$28.00 plus tax.
- Do not bury hazardous waste or pour it onto the ground. Never mix products together.

ROSSPORT

HOURS OF OPERATION

SATURDAY 10:00AM – 4:00PM

Rosspport utilizes a privately owned landfill site. There are no garbage pick-up services located within Rosspport. It is the homeowner or renters responsibility to deliver their garbage to the landfill site, with a \$2.00 charge for each garbage bag. A half-ton load is \$28.00 plus tax.

Sewage is treated using septic fields in line with guidelines from the Ministry of the Environment.

BYLAWS

Terrace Bay and Schreiber Township Bylaws are intended to keep our communities clean, healthy, and safe.

The goal of Municipal Bylaws is to preserve the quality of life of all residents.

Bylaw Officers are given the task to investigate complaints received from the public about alleged violations of various municipal bylaws. These regulations may include such things as:

Property Conditions, including graffiti
Excessive Noise
Signs (Unauthorized placement/construction)
Business Licensing
Zoning
Building
Snow/Ice removal

Enforcement procedures may take many courses. These enforcement proceedings are normally increasingly costly to the person in non-compliance, and may include direct enforcement. Each complaint is different and the enforcement proceedings are decided upon based on the individual case.

Consideration to be Taken When Initiating a Complaint

Complainant information is considered as confidential and will not be released to the person whose property is under complaint.

Often complaints are resolved amicably between neighbours. As a result, and if possible, it is recommended that each resident of Schreiber and Terrace Bay attempt to resolve their issues before contacting Bylaw Services.

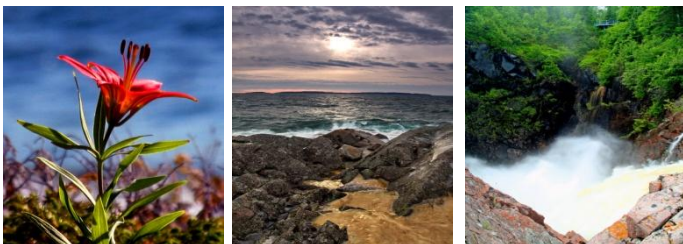

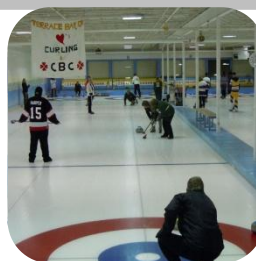

Schreiber is home to the recently completed Railway Heritage museum that highlights the community's background as the oldest railway community on the North Shore of Lake Superior. It builds on the history and culture both of Schreiber and the Canadian Pacific Railway. Schreiber was first founded in the 1880's as a railway construction camp. Initially called Isbester's Landing, the town later was renamed after a railway engineer, Sir Collingwood Schreiber, and it became a booming terminal for C.P.R. Subsequently, the area became home to hundreds of immigrants from Southern Italy, whose descendants remain there today. It is a must see for all railway enthusiasts and other visitors who are interested in the past.

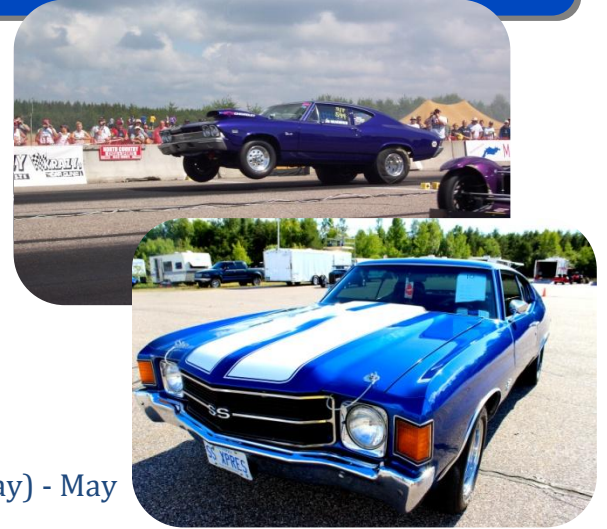

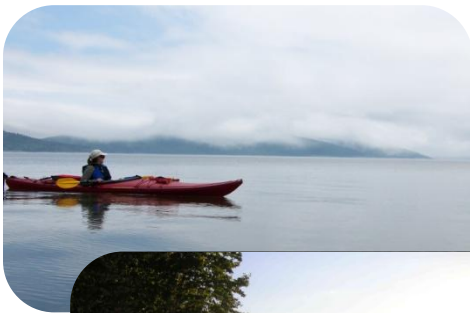
